Subject : No Objection Certificate in favour of Govt. Ayurvedic Medical
College and associated Hospital, Jammu.

Sir,

The desired "No Objection Certificate" in respect of following facts is being issued:

1. Number of Medical and Ayurved or Siddha or Unani Tibb institutions already existing in the State : 01 Ayurved (Private) and 02 Unani (private) institutions.
2. Number of seats available or number of Medical and Ayurved or Siddha or Unani practitioners being produced annually: 90 Ayurved and 100 Unani.
3. Number of Ayurved or Siddha or Unani Tibb practitioners registered with the State Council/Board of Indian Systems of Medicine : 2821 Ayurved & 2425 Unani.
4. Number of Ayurved or Siddha or Unani Tibb practitioners in Government Service : 280 Ayurved & 330 Unani (approx).
5. Number of vacant Government posts of Ayurved or Siddha or Unani Tibb doctors in the State, particularly in rural/difficult areas : 45 Ayurved.
6. Number of Ayurved or Siddha or Unani Tibb doctors registered with the State Employment Exchanges : Nil.
7. Ayurved or Siddha or Unani Tibb Doctors-population ratio in the State : 1:4448
8. How the establishment of the medical College would resolve the problem of deficiencies of qualified medical personnel in the State and improve the availability of such medical manpower in the State : The establishment of college will produce Ayurvedic graduates in the State and improve the availability of trained and qualified medical manpower in the State as well as address the shortage of qualified doctors.
9. The restrictions imposed by the State Government, if any, on students who are not domiciled in the State be specified : In the State of J&K Permanent Resident Certificate (PRC) is compulsory for admission in any Government institution and only State Subjects are allowed to seek admission in these Institutions.

10. Full justification for opening of the proposed medical College/increase in admission capacity/starting new or higher course with the opening of Govt Ayurvedic College in J&K, professional manpower, training on Ayurved specialities refresher courses/ reorientation trainings (CME, ROTP etc.) to existing Ayurvedic personal, pharmacognosy & pharmacological research etc. will be under taken. Establishment of Govt. Ayurvedic College in the state would provide specialized health care in Ayurved specialities in the state & generate job opportunities, for qualified personal as well.

11. Ayurved or Siddha or Unani Tibb Doctors-population ratio to be achieved - with opening of Govt. Ayurvedic College in the state more Ayurvedic Doctors shall be introduced into the system and hence Ayurved Doctors : population ratio would substantially improve over the existing ratio of 1:4448.

The Jammu & Kashmir Government has applied for establishment of Government Ayurvedic Medical College & Associated Hospital, Jammu, J&K. On careful consideration of the proposal, the Government of J&K has decided to issue "No Objection Certificate" to the applicant for establishment of an Ayurvedic Medical College with 60 seats for starting 1st Batch of BAMS course.

The Director General shall take up the matter with University of Jammu for affiliation of Govt Ayurvedic Medical College, Jammu, Central Council of Indian Medicine (CCIM) for inspection/permission thereof and with Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India for concurrence.

The Director General shall fulfil all the norms/guidelines required to make the Ayurvedic Medical College functional during the academic session 2016-17.

It is certified that:

- a) The applicant owns and manages a hospital with 50 bedded capacity and was established in the year 1965.
- b) It is desirable to establish an Ayurvedic Medical College, Jammu in the public interest for starting 1st Batch of BAMS course and
- c) Establishment of Ayurvedic Medical College for starting 1st batch of BAMS course at Govt Ayurvedic Medical College Jammu.

It is also certified that adequate clinical material as per norms of the Central Council of Indian Medicine is available with the proposed/existing Medical College. It is further certified that in case the applicant fails to create infrastructure for the Ayurvedic Medical College as per Central Council of Indian Medicine norms and fresh admissions are stopped by the Central Government, the State Government shall take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the College with the permission of the Central Government.
